Vermont Natural Coatings Breaks With Industry to Support California Supreme Court Decision on Safe Wood Finishes

alling on the public to demand nothing short of safe finishes formulated from sustainable resources, Vermont Natural Coatings has broken ranks with the national coatings industry to support a California Supreme Court ruling upholding stringent air quality safety regulations for coatings, including wood finishes. The ruling confirms the South Coast Air Quality Management District's (SCAQMD) authority to enact future air quality rules on architectural and industrial coatings even if technology doesn't currently exist to meet such standards.

"We wholeheartedly endorse the California Supreme Court decision and call on all states, including our home state of Vermont, to enact legislation that protects the public from health hazards associated with toxic finishes of any kind," said Vermont Natural Coatings Founder and President Andrew B. Meyer. "We have proven that safe, high performance finishes can be formulated from sustainable resources free of all carcinogens and mutagens. The public should demand nothing less for living and working environments, especially for schools."

Vermont Natural Coatings' patented PolyWhey® technology has emerged as a new category of wood finish that performs like solvent-based finish, applies with the ease of water borne finish but without the negative qualities associated with each. PolyWhey uses natural whey protein to displace toxic components such as benzene and formaldehyde traditionally found in wood finishes.

The American Coatings Association (ACA) voiced opposition to the court decision, saying "the court's ruling will now require paint and coatings manufacturers to reassess whether it is feasible to remain in the market in Southern California since doing so could negatively affect their ability to produce high-quality, high-performing products." The SCAQMD regulations for wood finishes

are established by the amount of volatile organic compounds (VOC) per liter of product. Vermont Natural Coatings products are currently available in California and will continue to be available. VNC finishes meet or fall below VOC limits in all 50 states and Canada.

"Our own Vermont Department of Health recently articulated, clearly, the potential health hazards associated with the application and off gassing associated with traditional solvent-based floor finishes that contain toxins like benzene and formaldehyde," Meyer continued. "As a parent of two young children I know the importance of improving air quality in public places, particularly in schools. It is imperative that we address the dangers of toxic fumes from chemical cleaners and newly finished floors."

Vermont Natural Coatings MVP Sport Floor Finish Featured in *Hardwood Floors* Magazine



"I applied PolyWhey exterior to my deck and it looked beautiful . . . until it rained the next morning. The porch was covered with what appeared to be milky white blisters and blotches. What's causing that and what should I do?"

The short answer is nothing! What happened is that before your topcoat of PolyWhey Exterior had fully cured, the rain reacted with the water and whey protein in the coating, causing the bubbles you see on the surface. While it might appear alarming, there's really no need to do anything because as the deck surface dries, the coating will revert to the desired finish. When fully cured, the deck will shed any moisture.
